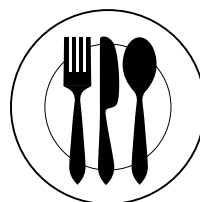
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## General Meeting

**Special Thanks** to Bill -W6MSI for hosting the annual Chili party in February. The turnout was good, Food was good, and seeing friends was good.

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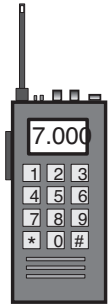
## Don't forget Amateur License Restructuring

### MOBILE TRIPS ???

Comments from members about the recent non turnout for a mobile run that the club said they wanted but the they did not show up. This is being voiced here to obtain a wider audience and in hope of getting a better response from the club.

The club requested at a General Meeting that there be scheduled mobile run once a quarter. We have, and we have had three very successful trips and three or more no shows. The difference seems to be that if any cliques in the club decide to go and tell all their friends, we have a good turnout. I can't help but draw a parallel with all the repeater projects that the club voted for but did not support.

-- During this last quarter we scheduled a day trip and as expected, no one showed. One member did drive over to West Sacramento just in case someone showed up without letting us know in advance.

-- Sorry about the poor turnout for the run. We're guilty of not keeping up with these things and weren't aware of it. We went on a mobile run several years ago led by JR and we were the only participants. I think the activity is a good one for the club but I don't know how to drum up more participation - probably need to contact potential mobilers about an upcoming run so they can set aside the time.

Some alternatives are:

1. Don't schedule any more such trips.
2. Pick a constant Sunday in each quarter so there is no confusion.
3. Ditto, but make it twice a year, Spring and Fall.
4. Have members sign up as much as a year ahead to lead a trip of their choosing on any non-conflicting date.

### DX DUES:

It has be suggested that the dues or time period for the DX-members be adjusted to give a better value to them since they really are only receiving the news letter and many time it is only a notice of the coming meeting.

This would require a change to the BYLAWS.

## How to Set Up Camp in the Dark

This was an unofficial trip to Organ Pipe Cactus Nat. Mon., AZ. Fred, W7KOZ, Bonnie, KC6PSZ, and I left on Saturday, Nov. 6, 1999. Ed, KE6AFB, and Sunny, KE6AFA, left a day later. We all towed folding trailers. Frank, W6GZI, and Jan, KD6HYE, invited us to camp in their yard in Yucca Valley. I gave them our location and ETA on 40 meters and we arrived after dark. We met Ed and Sunny the next night at the Ehrenberg AZ KOA after touring the Desert Queen Ranch in Joshua Tree NP. We set up after dark. The next day we toured the Yuma Territorial Prison State Park and got to Organ Pipe after dark. We spent a day and a half touring the park. Fred and Bonnie decided to stay longer. Ed, Sunny, and I drove back through Ajo on Wednesday and viewed the mine pit overlook. We stopped at the Ehrenberg KOA again. I talked to Frank across the river at Midland on 75 meters. Thursday we drove to Midland, NW of Blythe, where the Sam's Radio Hams were arriving for a monthly campout. Midland consists of concrete slabs in the desert where there had been a gypsum plant. Ed and Sunny left Friday to visit relatives. Frank led a 4WD day trip to Rice, where we found Patton's old Army airfield. I had more 40 meter contacts on the way home Sunday.
